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Introduction of the Institution

Our college is located in village Bramhani, adjacent to Kalmeshwar city. The Kalmeshwar city has great cultural heritage. It is situated in Nagpur district in Maharashtra twenty five kilometers away from Nagpur. The ancient name of Kalmeshwar was Kadambeshwar after the name of Lord Kadambeshwar. The city is surrounded by religious and historical places such as Dhapewada and Aadasa. In the vicinity of Kalmeshwar, there are about 40 industries in MIDC area. It is a taluka place having Nagar-Parishad and a population is about 30 thousands.

According to proverb "*Tamso ma jyotirgamaya*" to inculcate and promote scientific approach and interest, Dr. Bhabha Vidnyan Lokshikshan Sanstha was established in September 1981. The sanstha stared serving society through various social activities such as blood donation, eye donation, body donation, diagnostic camp, total and partial solar eclipse awareness programs, eradication of superstitions, science workshops etc.

Aims and Objectives

According to proverb "*Tamso ma jyotirgamaya*" irrespective of caste, creed, races the sanstha as well as college aims-

- To inculcate and develop scientific approach, interest and awareness among the society.
- To promote knowledge, communal harmony and national integration.
- To work for superstition eradication.
- To organize various scientific and social programs regarding health awareness, agricultural and pollution awareness.

These objectives as mentioned in institutional bylaws are achieved,

- By arranging lectures, seminars, exhibitions, general knowledge examinations, workshop for high school students, essay competitions etc.
- By organizing blood donation, eye donation, body donation and other diagnostic camps in association with other social institutions.
- Sy organizing Krishi Melava, UdyojaktaVikasShibir.
- By imparting knowledge on science subjects through class room teaching, practicals, excursions, competitions etc.
- By instituting memorial prizes.

The city had science education only up to Junior college level and need for science education at undergraduate level was increasingly felt. In order to provide facility for the same the sanstha started senior college named science college Kalmeshwar with a group PHYSICS, CHEMISTRY, MATHEMATICS, MARATHI, ENGLISH in August 1992 permission letter No. NGC/3592/5207/ Higher and Technical Education and Employment section Dated 21/08/1992.

In 1994 another group BOTANY, ZOOLOGY and CHEMISTRY was introduced at undergraduate level. In 1996, the sanstha received donation in the form of agricultural land from a great donor and the college is now recognized as *Late Kanhobaji Zolbaji Shrikhande Science College, Bramhani Kalmeshwar*.

Taking into consideration the need for computer education, the subject COMPUTER SCIENCE was introduced to the curriculum from the session 2001-2002 which is run on permanently unaided basis.

Government of Maharashtra and Nagpur University permitted Dr. Bhabha Vidnyan Lokshikshan Sanstha Kalmeshwar to start the college from the session 1992-93 temporarily on un-aided basis . Moreover the government sanctioned 100% grant from session 2000-2001. Till date the college has not received any non-salary grant. The college has been recognized by UGC under section 2f and 12B of the UGC Act 1956 6ince 2009 vide letter no. F.No.8-222/2009 (CPP-I)
